



Extreme Weather Conditions Customer Guidance

Tarmac surfaces, like all materials, need a little extra care during very hot weather, especially when they're newly laid. In extended periods of heat, the binder course can soften, which may make the surface more susceptible to light 'scuffing' from vehicle tyres or marks from concentrated loads such as ladders, motorbike stands, or trailer jockey wheels.

To keep your driveway looking its best, it's wise to avoid placing unnecessary stress on the surface during extreme heat. In particular, try to avoid sharp wheel turns while the vehicle is stationary, especially with power steering, as this can twist the warm surface.

If scuffing does occur, please don't worry. These marks are usually superficial and will fade naturally as the surface weathers and settles into a consistent appearance. This advice is especially important for south-facing or sheltered areas, where heat can linger, and for locations used by heavier vehicles.
